Our school is a very busy environment, and we aim to respond to queries as quickly as we can. In order to do this, staff will prioritise urgent issues. Where possible, please avoid turning up at the school without a prior appointment. Instead, please contact us beforehand so a mutually convenient time can be arranged to meet.

We aim to respond to phone and email queries within 2-3 days. When you contact by phone or email, please be ready to provide:

- Your full name and relationship to the pupil
- The pupil's full name
- The pupil's tutor class or house
- Details of what the query is.

If all of this information is provided in your email or in the initial phone call, it enables staff to direct your query to the right person and allows staff to prioritise urgent issues.

Misuse includes:

- Giving fireworks (except F1 fireworks like sparklers) to anyone under 18
- Using fireworks in any public place, including public parks and beaches
- Setting off fireworks in a private place that go into a public place
 - Using fireworks outside permitted times

Fireworks can only be used between 6pm and 11pm except for Bonfire Night when the cut off is midnight and New Year's Eve, the night of Chinese New Year, and Diwali, when the cut off is 1am

The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) is an important, legally binding agreement signed by 196 countries (as of 12 July 2022) which outlines the fundamental rights of every child, regardless of their race, religion or abilities.

The Convention has 54 articles that **cover all aspects of a child's life** and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights. The convention is universal—these rights apply to every child and the convention entitles every child to claim them. As a school we consider the articles in our values and everything we do.

INTRODUCING ARTICLE 12

Article 12 – respect for the views of the child

Every child has the right to **express their views, feelings and wishes** in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right <u>applies at all times</u>, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.



REFLECTION

Give yourself some time and try to find a space where you can be quiet and think...

- How does it feel when you know you are being listened to and your views are respected?
- When has your voice and your views made a difference?
- If adults are not creating a space for your views to be heard, how can you respectfully claim this right? Who could help you?
- Are there more things you could speak up about in your own life or in the wider world? How might you do this - on your own or with friends?
- Our Pupil parliament gives us all a voice so if you are interested in joining <u>still</u> please let us know or feed issues your rep so they can raise them at parliament.
