Drama and Musical Theatre Summer School – Reconnect Regal Theatre, Bathgate

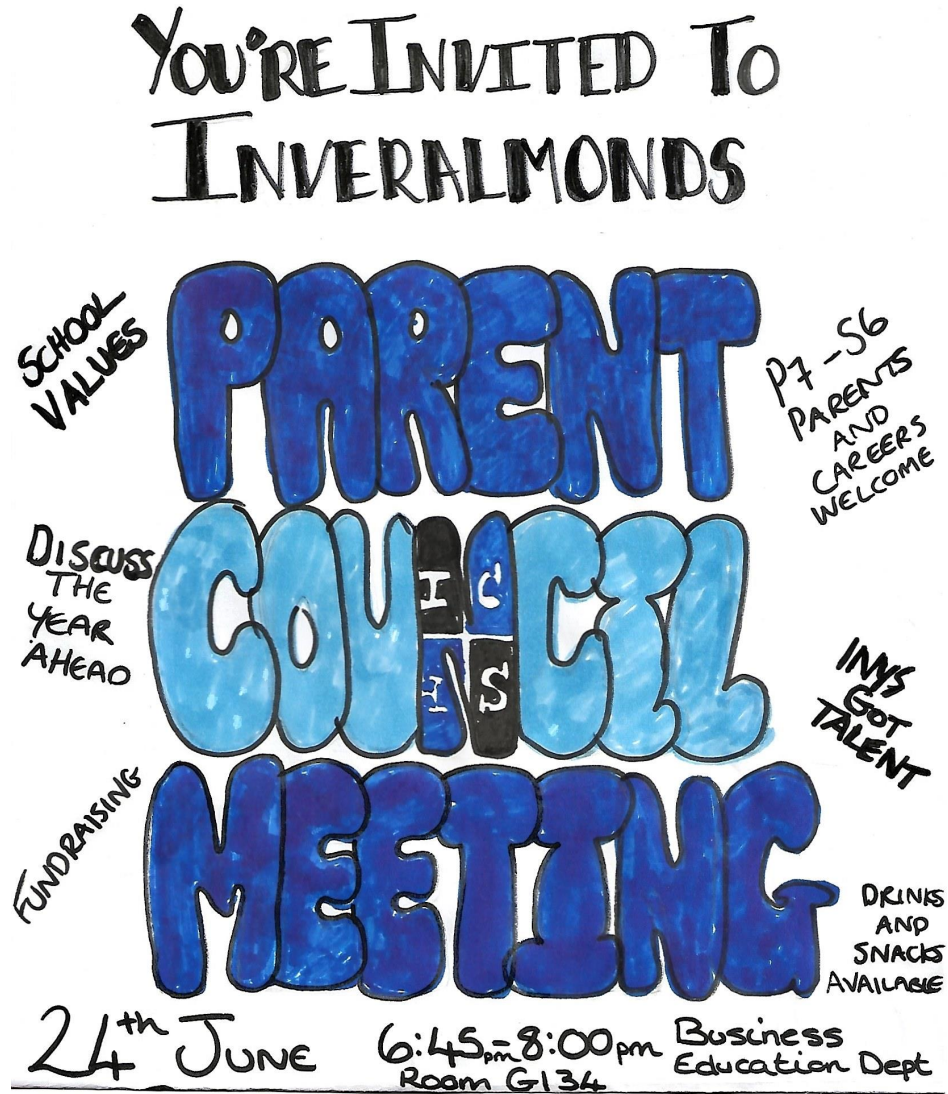

Update to dining hall procedures

QR Payment:- Our dining hall recently introduced the use of QR codes for payment. This is an alternative to the payment card which pupils currently used. Staff are sharing a unique QR code with pupils which can be put onto their phone. This links to their existing account and allows them to pay for food. This secure method of payment is significantly increasing the speed of service at tills.

Queuing System:- From Monday 9th June, all pre orders will be collected from the separate servery on the right of our dining hall. All queues at the main servery will be QR, card and debit card payment. This will improve the efficiency of our queues.



Are you in S5 and thinking about a future in law? CMS is offering two fantastic opportunities designed to help students from backgrounds that are underrepresented in top law firms and universities.

Applications are now open for the CMS Law Scholarships and CMS Connect work experience programme! CMS Law Scholarships offer four students in Scotland £3,000 per year throughout their law degree, plus mentoring, paid work experience, and ongoing support. If you'll be the first in your family to go to university and your school has more than 20% of students eligible for free school meals, you could be eligible to apply. You'll need to answer a question about what law you would change and why as part of your application.

CMS Connect is a paid work experience programme running from 28 July to 1 August 2025. It includes mentoring, workshops, and the chance to build skills that are valuable in any career. Both programmes are open to S5 students moving into S6 after exams.
